

Halton County Seal Campaign Reached New High, \$47,737

The Halton County TB and RD Association's Annual Christmas Seal Campaign for 1971 was closed January 31. The Campaign was under the chairmanship of C. L. McFadden, Executive of the Ford Motor Company of Canada Ltd. Details of the Campaign have

now been released by Mrs. M. E. Lunau, Executive Secretary of the Association, showing that an all-time high has been achieved in Halton County. The total amount collected was \$49,737.24. This is a 7.1 percent increase over last year. This year seals were sent to 50,832 homes in

Halton County. The per capita return was 27.2 cents, compared to 26 last year.

MANY REASONS
Success of the campaign is due to many things. There is no door-to-door canvass - it is done through the mails using the Toronto Dominion Bank, 283 Lakeshore Rd. East, Oakville, as the collection depot.

Enrolment Shrink Could Cost Teachers' Jobs

Teachers on permanent contracts with their education boards could start losing their jobs as classroom enrolments continue to shrink and technology expands its role in education, a former Halton County education superintendent told 900 Halton teachers at the Galaxy Club Friday.

Doug Lawless, now director of the Ottawa Board of Education, said the education system has "known nothing but expansion" for many years but change has arrived. "If present trends continue, 30 percent of the elementary school classrooms will be empty in 1976".

He said teachers have become redundant and new methods in education have called for the elimination of some of the old methods, including teachers

"Education used to be related to income but this is no longer true. The public knows it and the students know it".

100 GUEST SPEAKERS
All high school students in the county took the day off as their teachers attended all-day seminars in Oakville. In the morning the teachers attended one of 33 seminars in General Wolfe and White Oaks High Schools.

The annual professional development day introduced new concepts of teaching and re-introduced some older ones with the assistance of about 100 guest speakers.

Air Cadets Even Sponsors May Find Cadets Good Competition

On Monday March 6 the squadron van was pressed into service transporting the first group of cadets to the Georgetown Revolver Club range at Limehouse for range practice under the supervision of Lt. M. Ferguson.

To permit fire-arm training as a course of instruction a squadron must meet and comply with rigid Canadian forces regulations, before the issue of rifles and ammunition to a squadron the proposed range is inspected and must meet C.A.F. safety standards. Supervision on the range must be under the direction of a C.A.F. qualified range officer.

Lt. Ferguson, who transferred to 756 squadron last fall has been qualified for several years and held this position in the Toronto area before coming to Georgetown.

Among the various competitions available to the squadron are - The Dominion Challenge Shields sponsored by the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association for the Air Cadet rifle team posting the best results during the months of January, February and March each year.
