One item of business Esquesing Council would have acted on Monday night was a move to have the Seventh Line of Esquesing renamed Currie Road. The snow storm cancelled Esquesing's regular meeting.

Esquesing Reeve Tom Hill said last week that the township council wants to apply the Currie

name to the Seventh Line in honour of the grand old man of Hallow politics, 81 year old George Currie.

The Seventh Line extends from Huraby on Steeles Avenue north through Ashgrove, Stewarttown, Silvercreek to Ballinafad. It is currently known as Trafalgar Road and County Road 3.

**FITTING**

Elizabeth Robson, a solicitor living in Esquesing, asked county council's road committee to rename the road for George Currie who was councillor and reeve of Esquesing and was county warden for two terms. No other man has been warden twice.

Miss Robson said, "It would be fitting to commemorate the tremendous contribution this man has made and is still making to the community while he is living and contributing".

**Improve Fatality Corner With Rover Recommendation**

One year ago Butch Elwood of the Second Norval Templar Rover Crew died in a car accident at the intersection of the Town Line and Number 10

sideroad near Norval.

Last week county council's roads committee accepted all five recommendations made by the Rover crew from a traffic study of the intersection.

**BEACON FLASHER**

D. Fishburn, skipper of the crew, part of the scouting movement and intended for boys 16 to 22, presented the traffic

report to council and said other crew members had hoped to be there but they were at school or work.

The crew's recommendations included a beacon flasher on the stop sign controlling the 10 sideroad. It was installed and put into operation last week.

**ALL APPROVED**

Other recommendations, all

approved by the committee without referring them to the county engineer for study and a report, were: a speed limit sign to slow traffic on the sideroad to 50 miles an hour; a 1,000-foot - to stop - sign, warning; improved checkerboard dead-end signs; improved maintenance to clean sand and gravel away from the corner.

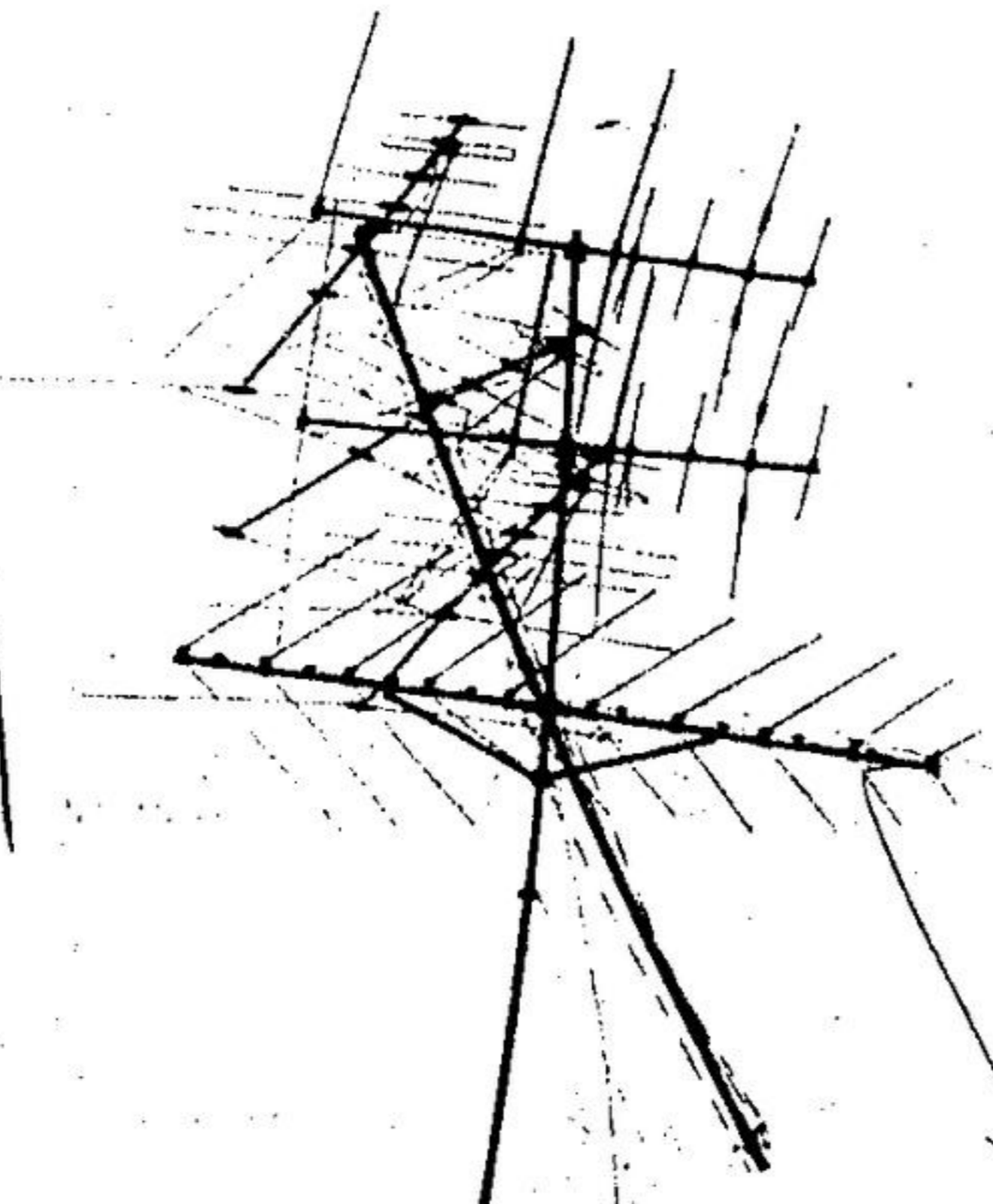

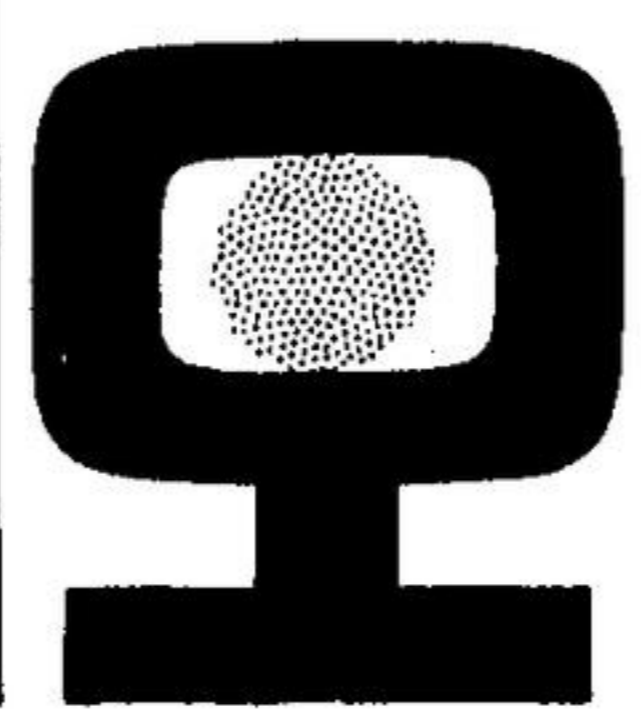
