### Weight Lifters Put Muscle Into Their Alpine Meetings

Brawny men, bearded with perspiration, staring fixedly at themselves in the mirror, as they strain to lift weights, is the scene upstairs at the Alpine Health Club three nights a week. It's a weight lifting class where the heavy breathing means only that they are conditioning their respiratory system.

Monday, Wednesday and Friday nights any man over 16 can make sure no-one ever kicks sand in his face, because he's a 97 pound weakling.  
Reg Benoit, a hefty musclemaster, conducts the classes which started three weeks ago. In the progressive program, the weight lifters start with light weights and work up as they build their muscles. The classes are for everyone not just for the would-be Charles Atlases, since they build up the body, reduce weight, and generally tone the muscles and respiratory system.  
The mirrors are not there for the men to admire themselves, but to help them concentrate on the proper stance and to show if they are distributing the weight equally.
