Psychadelic Six 31; Pin Vultures 24; King Pins 15; Crackpots 14; Pin Busters 13; Odd Balls 8.

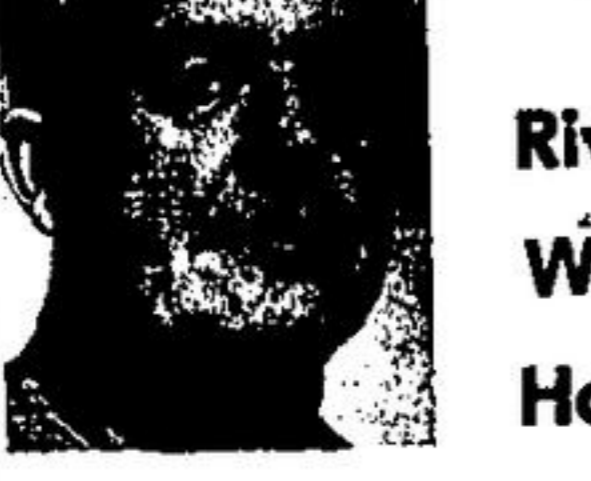
**SATURDAY JUNIORS**

### River Conditions Will Determine How to Fish

It's difficult for me or anyone else to predict just what conditions will be prevailing in the rivers on opening day of our regular trout season. Which opens at midnight on April 23. The river conditions will determine just what method of angling one will have to decide on to catch his first trout of the season.

**MURKY WATER**  
Fish do have a sense of smell so if the water is unclear and roe and worms are a good bet. If high and clear or low and clear they can be caught on various other lures and baits as well. Mepps lures to start off with, silver wobblers, Blanchard spoons of all colours, flat fish, small plugs, such as Mirrolures, lazy lures, and believe it or not, orange sponge squares and small white marshmallows.

The fact remains that one gets the same thrill from playing and landing the prize, regardless of what bait or lure the trout took.

**PINE RIVER FIGHTERS**  
I can vouch for that statement. When I angled for big rainbow in the Pine River, I used a No. 2 hook with a down-eye and a turned out point. On the hook were at least two large night-crawlers. They were hooked in such a way that they sort of resembled a small octopus. The bait was tossed in above where the trout were and allowed to roll over the gravel bottom, it was our belief that the rainbow

gobbled them up because they thought the crawlers were going to interfere with their spawning beds.

**SET THE HOOK**  
Usually they would move upstream when the bait was taken, and then was the time to set the hook and hope for the best, and I mean just that. Playing a big trout in a lake is one thing, but in a river like the Pine, which is full of log jams, and under-water snags is a different story.

For one to say they fight hard is putting it mildly. Usually they go berserk, in fact they have one thing in mind, and that is to tear loose.

Good strong leaders, strong hooks, and a rod sturdy enough to snub up their strong rushes are a must. And last, but not least, a net large enough and strong enough is necessary.

Some anglers net their prize head first and some tail first, depending on just what sort of a lure might foul on the net mesh.

Where to fish for the species is something else. Personally, I like a spot where one can get away from the crowd.

**SPECKLED TROUT**  
Fishing for smaller speckled trout in smaller streams is another story. Small minnow type streamers are good if the water is fairly clear. If not, a size eight hook with a straight eye and a small single, silver pilot spinner works wonders with various baits on the hook. Weight is not necessary because in shallower streams it only impedes the natural drift of the bait.

The small pilot spinner will attract them. Other lures such as small wobblers, spinners, etc. are also good.

It's always best to carry a few small dry flies just in case a warm day brings on a hatch.

**NATURAL RESOURCES**  
The end of March saw the retirement of the name — Lands and Forests — and signals the emergence of the Ministry of Natural Resources with much broader responsibilities.

**SAUGEEN RAINBOW**  
It's to be hoped that my rainbow trout will be back from the taxidermists in time to be on display in The Herald office window prior to opening day of the trout season.

**SINKING LEADERS**  
A new leader for fly fishing is on the market for those that want a sinking type. It is a knotless, tapered one, and should be worth a try.

**MOST WELCOME**  
Sure, several people have seen robins, and a few weeks ago at that, but I had to wait until April 11 to see six on our back and front lawns. I might add that they were feasting on earth worms. They were a treat for me to see
