Trustee Calls Proposed Guidelines For Hiring "Loaded with Dynamite"

Halton County Separate School Board trustees voted last week to defer to a later meeting discussion of new hiring guidelines for separate school teachers, an issue one trustee called "loaded with dynamite".

"I think you could spend a whole night discussing it and come to no conclusion," said trustee Jim Hourigan in moving to postpone discussion.

He said the proposal by Rev. D. J. Murphey, chaplain of the Ontario Separate School Trustees Association, had been discussed at great length at a recent Toronto gathering of trustees to no conclusion.

DEFER

The board voted 6 to 4 to defer discussion. Although Hourigan's original motion had referred to a "special meeting", no mention of whether the later discussion should be open or closed was made in the final motion.

The proposed guidelines are designed to help the board's "apostolic Catholics" as teachers (an apostolic Catholic is partially defined as a committed Christian involved with the organized church and following the general accepted practice of a Christian life as defined by his community).

They are now trying to find a cure for bronchitis and asthma. The flower committee gave their report, and then the program was turned over to Mrs. John Bird. It was a panel discussion on the objectives of the W.I. and what is hoped to accomplish in W.I. work.

The women formed into five groups, one headed by Mrs. Gordon Wingfield on homemaking; one by Mrs. John Ruddle on leadership; by Mrs. James Carney on community; by Mrs. Bob Alexander on resources; and by Mrs. Frank Ruddle on citizenship.

After discussion, many helpful ideas were given which will be an inspiration for next year's W.I. The motto was given by Mrs. John Ruddle and contained some grand ways to be a good homemaker and citizen. It read "Blessed are W.I. homemakers, for they have inherited sound family values on which they can build a more worthwhile future."

Mrs. William Allison conducted a plant sale of shrubs and bulbs which brought a nice little sum for the W.I. Mrs. Hector Bird gave the courtesies, and a social hour followed.
