Halton Liberals Election

Rud Whiting Says PM's Record is "Extraordinary"

Halton MP Rud Whiting said Friday night that the four-year record of the government of Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau is "not only defensible, but is in fact extraordinary".

Whiting addressed the annual meeting of the Halton and Halton East Liberal Association and told about 70 gathered Liberals that "if our record is to be criticized for having done too much, I would prefer that to having done too little".

He said the government has made "life more enjoyable for all Canadians by enacting the most comprehensive legislation for consumer protection", has sought to preserve the quality of the environment for present and future generations, to humanize the criminal law and officially recognize the multi-cultural character of Canada.

Whiting also lauded his government for the most comprehensive tax reforms in Canadian history reforms which resulted in a more equitable distribution of the tax burden.

And he said the best evidence of the government's success in the creation of jobs have been the criticisms from British Columbia premier W. A. C. Bennett and federal Conservative leader Robert Stanfield.

He chided Stanfield for his additional criticisms of the government's regional development policies, intended to promote a more equitable distribution of wealth between "the have and the have-not provinces".

"Someone should remind him of his record in Nova Scotia", said Whiting, noting that Stanfield's failure was most evident in the planned multi-million dollar heavy water plant for the province.

"The citizens of Nova Scotia have invested more in that than the citizens of the United States have in the space program", he said. "The only difference is that the Americans have got to the moon, while the Nova Scotia heavy water plant has yet to produce a pound of heavy water."
