Halton is the second fastest growing county in Ontario, according to Statistics Canada. Only Peel exceeds this county in population growth by percentage in the period between 1966 and 1971, skyrocketing from a population of 172,321 in 1966 to 259,402 last year. Peel recorded a net gain of 50.5 percent and is the fastest growing area in Canada for that period of time.

In the Toronto-Hamilton-Niagara area, four counties exceeded the province's average growth rate of 10.7 percent. Halton (25.4 percent), Dufferin (23.9) and York (21.8 percent) were second, third and fourth in Ontario and the metropolitan municipality of Toronto gained 10.9 percent to take 15th place. Niagara region and Norfolk counties showed gains of over six percent while Haldimand was up eight percent.

By-Law to Stop Up Road Allowance

NOTICE of a by-law to stop up and convey to the abutting owner part of the original road allowance at the corner of Mountainview Road South and Guelph Street in the Town of Georgetown.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Georgetown proposes to pass a by-law to stop up and convey to the abutting owner certain lands being composed of part of the Allowance for Road between Concession 9 and 10, part of the East Half of Lot 16 in Concession 9 as dedicated for road widening by Registered Plan No. 612 and part of the West Half of Lot 16 in Concession 10 as dedicated for road widening by Registered Plan No. 617, formerly in the Township of Esquesing now in the said Town of Georgetown, which lands are more particularly described as follows:

Lessons Started Sunday Burgundy Club Professional Played Tennis In Europe

Tennis is the "in" summer sport with its popularity increasing every day. The professionals, on television, immaculately dressed in white, with their bullet-like line drives, have helped the boom along.

The Burgundy Club in Norval, has joined the tennis craze, with the completion of two courts, alongside the large outdoor swimming pool. The scarcity of court space and waiting for public courts has sparked a court building boom in many private clubs.

Tennis lessons, started last Sunday at the Burgundy Club, are not limited to club members. Anyone is welcome to take lessons from professional Edward Bonisch, who has taught in many clubs in the Toronto area. Prior to coming to Canada he played professional tennis in Europe.

SERVE
Both individual and group lessons are available to beginners and advanced players. He feels the most important tennis tactic is the serve, with net play and volley next in importance. "The strategy of the game is usually learned naturally after the others have been mastered," says Bonisch.

As the players develop, the club hopes to get into area and county competition.

PADDLE TENNIS
Paddle tennis, a tennis game played with king sized ping pong bats, on a court two thirds normal size, is also being introduced on the volley ball court. This game is big in other parts of Canada and the United States. Another innovation at the Burgundy Club is the beginning

of swimming lessons for every group from pre-beginner to senior. The class will be taught by Glenda McKay, a qualified Red Cross instructor who taught at Georgetown Pool. The swimming lessons will also be open to non-members.

The indoor pool, in use all winter, is still in use on chilly days.

BILLIARDS
Another type of pool, a pool table, is also in use in the large lounge which overlooks the pool, while downstairs two saunas take the kinks out of the muscles after the tennis or volley ball games.

The Club takes advantage of its scenic setting on the banks of the Credit, even in winter with snowmobile trails through the wooded areas along the river.
