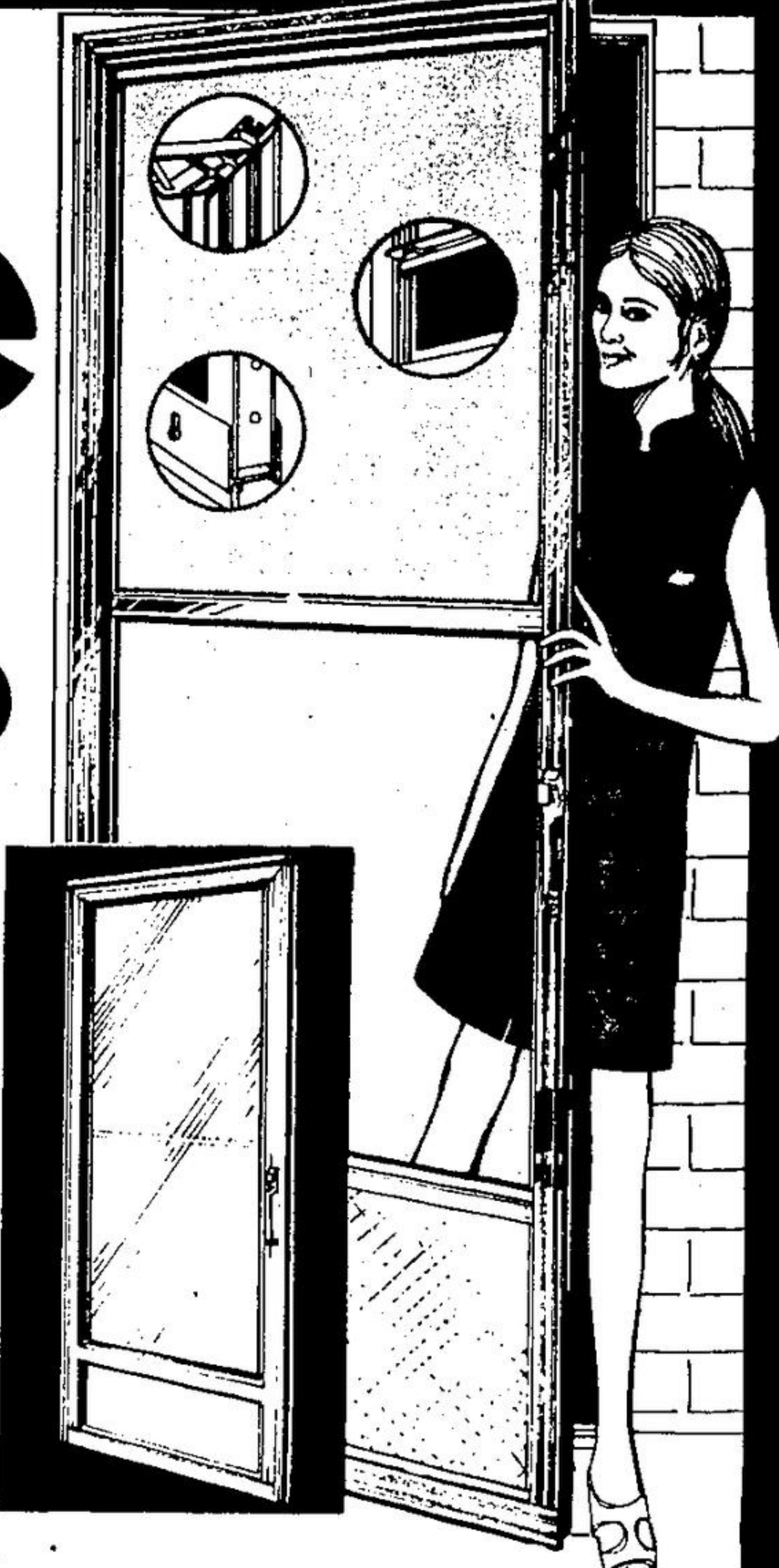

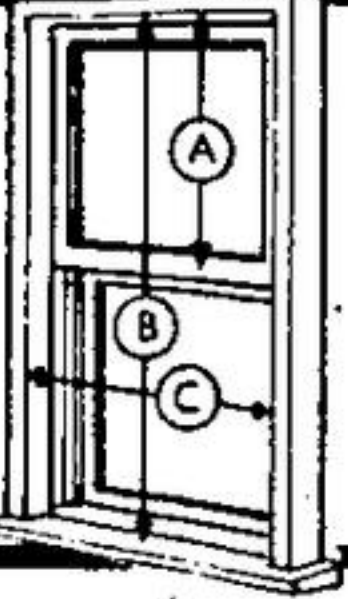
Measuring for DOORS and WINDOWS

1. DOORS—Use outside measurements. Measure frame opening where you would normally put wooden storm door. Take measurements at narrowest points.

2. View storm door from outside. If hinges to your left, order left hand door - if to your right, order right hand hinged door.

3. WINDOWS—Use outside measurements. Measure from opening where you would normally set a wood storm sash.

A is width between side casings;
B is height from sill to bottom of top casing;
C is height from bottom of top casing to centre of meeting rail.
Note: Add width A and height B to obtain total inches of opening size.
