Points Out Sixth Line Danger Spots

Traffic hazards in the 6th Line area were drawn to the Monday night, in a letter from Art McAllister, R.R.1

Mr. McAllister contended the 6th Line north from the river should have "watch for children" signs, and speed limit signs. He pointed out, too, that the steep incline to a busy road, where the 6th Line, and 22 Sideroad meet is a dangerous slippery intersection in winter.
