# Junior Age Limit Depletes Senior Ranks Coaches Say

With the age limit being the way it is in the East Halton junior and senior football leagues, a boy can go through high school playing five years of junior ball but no senior.

If a player is 16 years of age on September 1 he is eligible to play junior football and many students are 16 or 17 years old when they graduate.

With accelerated classes and birthdays after September 1, the junior teams had no trouble attracting plenty of players this year but some of the senior teams are rather sparse.

Fred Kotani, senior coach at Georgetown District High School had 24 players turn out for his team while there were 110 boys trying out for the junior team.

one year for next season's football season.

George Hill, the Georgetown junior coach, agrees with Kotani. He says, "The players don't improve that much if they're always playing in the same age group. A kid can play four years and be in grade 12 and he plays against a kid in grade nine. It's crazy".

He feels that if the age limit was lowered the younger players would be given a better chance to develop and the boys who move up to senior ball would improve by playing against people in an older age bracket.

**NOT GOOD**  
"The way it is now", says Kotani, "you've got 13 and 14-year-olds playing against 17 year olds."

League convener Maris Polls admits that the seniors are "slim in number this year". "The trouble last year was that they tried to push the age drop through in all sports, and that just isn't good".

Polls does feel an age change is due in football however and it promises to be a prime issue when the coaches get together at the end of the season to discuss the situation. The vote to change the age limit was close last year and Polls feels it should pass this year.

**OTHER VIEW**  
There are other views to this issue however and the reasoning behind them is every bit as logical as the previous.

Gary Turnbull, junior co-coach at Oakville Trafalgar High School says that if the age was lowered the juniors that would be affected, "would miss a year of ball when they go to senior because they aren't good enough".

**NOT PROGRESSING**  
However, junior Rebel coach George Hill says, "If a guy can play two years of junior ball, he's good enough to play senior".

Hill like some of the other coaches feel that any player who plays junior ball for three, four and even five years is simply treading water and not really progressing in his ability.

Kotani also feels that the age difference between a grade nine student playing against a grade 12 student in junior ball is more likely to cause injury.

"Soccer and softball season is ending, and hockey will be the big news in sports in Georgetown as the winter months approach. Follow the news in the Herald."


