Projects Have Marked Time

Credit Valley Conservation Authority Ups Levy 25 PerCent

Credit Valley Conservation Authority will raise its levy on the 16 municipalities within the watershed by 25 percent over the 1972 level following acceptance of a resolution at the authority's meeting last Wednesday night.

The authority's budget for 1972 was more than \$1 million of which 50 percent is covered by government grants. Approximately \$300,000 is raised from the municipal levy. The 25 percent increase proposed, on which the 1973 budget will be based, will mean an increase of more than \$100,000. All figures are approximate.

A member for the authority in presenting the resolution said the increased levy was necessary "because we needed

more money to do what we felt had to be done".

He said the advisory board felt the 25 percent increase would be acceptable.

PROGRAMS WAIT
The conservation authority is faced with ambitious programs which have been deferred over the past years but which it is hoped will be accomplished next year.

The conservation authority levy, even with the increase, compares favorably with that of surrounding conservation authority areas. Halton for instance is almost double the Credit Authority levy and Metro Toronto operates on three levies. "We are still well below others in the area", said the spokesman.

Etiquette is Subject In Talk to Sorority

"Introductions and invitations" was the subject of an informative cultural program presented by Mrs. Norma Tripp to members of Zeta Phi Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi at the home of Mrs. Dorothy McCarthy.

Many things we do are not always proper etiquette, she said. In introducing two people, the elder person should come first. In husband and wife, the latter is first named.

Abbreviations in letters are not considered polite, she said. One should write September 13 1972, not Sept. 13-72. For example, Check facts, use a pen, no red ink.

Four Christmas Card Deadlines In October

Some mailing deadlines for Christmas cards going overseas by surface are already past. Christmas cards can be sent to international destinations, except U.S., at three different rates. Sealed cards must travel first class, which means automatic air mail service, at a rate of 15 cents for the first ounce.

Unsealed cards can be sent air mail, 12 cents for the first ounce, or surface, eight cents for the first ounce. Cards sent by surface may still be airtel part way or through to destination depending on aircraft space availability.

Deadlines for unsealed Christmas cards at surface rate already expired are: Oct. 6—India and Ceylon. The other October deadlines are October 13—Australia; October 20—Africa; and October 27—The Orient, Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay, Uruguay and Cuba.
