

Hundred and Thirteen Receive Honour Graduation Diplomas

One hundred and thirteen young men and women, including 31 Ontario scholars, received honour graduation diplomas at the high school Friday.

Graduates, many of them who are continuing their education at universities, community colleges and nursing schools, and others who have embarked on careers in business and industry, flocked back to the commencement.

They attended a dinner earlier, at which K. N. Craig, now in Burlington, was guest speaker. Mr. Craig was a vice principal at the school last year.

Commencement exercises, held in the cafeteria, featured diploma presentations also to the Grade 12 graduating class. A number of special prizes were presented also, to grads and undergrads, by representatives of

organizations and businesses donating these.

Principal M. J. Furlong, in his opening remarks, mentioned that the school has an enrolment of 1725 and a staff of 92 this year.

DISCRIMINATE
He urged graduates to practice discrimination . . . "not in the sense you might think," he cautioned, "but in your reading, writing, listening and watching."

This is the main purpose of education, he pointed out, to create a thinking person, who doesn't blindly follow mob reactions.

Hilton Earnest Bohner, of Georgetown, said the graduating class has seen changes in the education system, some of which have been hard to accept by "old timers."

But, he said, students will appreciate later the trend away from "filling a bucket with facts and pouring this into students' heads to be regurgitated for exams."

Today, students have an opportunity to learn how to learn and how to think, he said. That it is appreciated is shown in the decrease in the rate of school drop-outs, he concluded.

SCHOOL BAND
Selections by the school band were interspersed during the program, with a trombone solo by Bruce Gregg among the highlights.

Rev. Peter Barrow of Knox Presbyterian Church gave the invocation. Diplomas were presented by various staff members and by Ron Chapman, district inspector. Vice principal D. Van Vliet was emcee for the program, which concluded with a valedictory address by Bruce Stockfish, now a student at the University of Western Ontario, London.
