IN THE MAIL BAG— Sanitation Best Protection Against Hepatitis Spread

Milton, Ontario. The Editor, Georgetown Herald, 22 Main Street East, Georgetown, Ontario.

Dear Sir: Recently we have had some inquiries from interested people regarding information on Infectious Hepatitis. We are enclosing a short article on the subject which will inform the public of basic information about this disease and trust you will find available space to publish it in your newspaper. Hepatitis means "inflammation of the liver." Infectious Hepatitis is caused by a virus passed from one person to another. It is transmitted, most commonly by hands, from the stools of the infected patient to the gastrointestinal tract of a well person. Good sanitation and personal hygiene are the surest means of halting the spread of infectious hepatitis and protecting you, your family, and your neighbours. Observe the following health rules: (1) Wash hands carefully after going to the bathroom and before meals, and be sure your children follow these practices. (2) Teach children not to put objects other than food in their mouths. Yours sincerely, J. H. Chamberlain, M.D., D.P.H., Medical Officer of Health & Director, Halton County Health Unit.
