Retain Gower Court in Street Name Change

Snowmobile Hits Dog, Pole, Riders Are Injured

A snowmobile accident sent two to the hospital and killed a dog on Sargent Road, December 5 at 7:30 p.m.

Garfield Laforest and his passenger John Pentland suffered fractures and cuts and bruises, when a dog ran out in front of them travelling on the shoulder of the road. The '69 Skidoo hit the dog then hit a hydro pole on the median strip of Sargent Road.

The Skidoo received \$125 damage to the left ski, runner and cow.

A collision in the Georgetown Market Centre parking lot caused a total of \$200 damage to a '72 Chevelle driven by David Hewitt, 34 Delrex Blvd. North, and \$75 to the '70 Duster driven by Keith Bull, 240 Archdeacon Drive, Brampton.

With only one change from the original plan, a by-law renaming a number of Georgetown streets received final approval from Georgetown council last week.

Residents of Gower Court objected to becoming Gower Road, and council deleted this change from the final by-law.

Clerk administrator Douglas Pritchard said residents of streets affected will be given first warning before the actual change takes place.

Business people, particularly, will have to have time to change stationery and their street listings in the telephone book, he said.

EXPENSE CLAIMS

Ernest Sykes wondered if the town could be faced with claims for expenses incurred in the change-over.

Cr. Harry Levy's opinion was that, if the town follows regulations laid down, it will not be responsible for such claims.

Major changes to be made include incorporation of Tyers Avenue, Delrex Boulevard North and South into Delrex Boulevard.

Mill Street will be extended to take in the whole area from McNabb to Charles. This will drop the name Young Street completely, and rename portions of Water and John Streets.

John Street East will become merely John Street.

Water Street will disappear entirely by extending Park Avenue to Mill Street.

King Street East and West and Emery Street will be consolidated as King Street.

The portion of Churchill Crescent between Princess Anne and George Street will become part of Charles Street.

Main Street South will be extended to take in all the downtown business blocks south of Guelph Street.

Swerving to avoid a car with high beam headlights, travelling on the centre of the road, caused Angus A. McArthur, 4 Stevens Crescent, to hit a parked car belonging to Roland Haines, 107 Joseph Street, Glen Williams.

The accident happened on Duncan Drive, with \$400 damage done to the '70 Chrysler, driven by McArthur, and \$800 damage to the rear end of the Haines car, a '69 Oldsmobile.

Mrs. Audrey McArthur was taken to Georgetown hospital by her husband, and later released.

Slippery roads caused a collision on Raylawn Crescent, December 10 at 4:30 p.m. when cars driven by Laurent Gagnon, 51 Mill Street, Apt. 3, collided with a car driven by Harold Markle, 145 Raylawn Crescent. A total of \$200 damage was done to the Gagnon car and \$150 to the Markle car.
