

The Creche Is Adored All Over The World

Of all the traditional activities of Christmastime, none is more enjoyed than the preparation of the little Christmas creche, the miniature Bethiehem stable,

Not only in the United States is this tradition honored . . . but all over the civilized world. From the Bethlehem "cave" of the Syrian youngsters to the Jeslicky in Czechoslovakia, to Mexico where the people are setting up their Posada, all are sharing in a ceremony of reverence and love.

In the creche are all the Nativity figures: the Holy Mother, Mary; Joseph; the Wise Men; the shepherds and their flock . . . the cattle, the donkeys, the sheep, the lambs and all the creatures which inhabited the stable area . . . all gathered around the Baby in the manger. the manger.

Throughout most of Europe from earliest Christian times the custom of recreating the Nativity scene has spread. Often the figures were delicately carved of wood, precious to the owners and handed down from generation to generation. A tender link of devetion devotion.

The first creche, according to carllest records, was made in 1223. In Italy presepe is the name for the creche. There have been many wonderful presept. In Rome there is one in the Church of Ara Coeli containg a Bambino said to have been carved from an olive tree from the Mount of Olives. from the Mount of Olives.

The presepe which is con-sidered the most famous Christian Crib in the world is also in Rome, housed in the Basilica of Saints Cosmas and Damian. The scene covers an area of 45x21 feet and shows the manger scene, the palace of Herod, and farmlands and villages in living, realistic panorama that actually reflect the customs of the 17th century Hundres of wooden figures have been hand-carved by

famous artisans. In Spanish, posada means an inn or lodging place, but it has come to mean more specifically the inn of the Nativity story.




