Permit Issued for Seniors Apartments

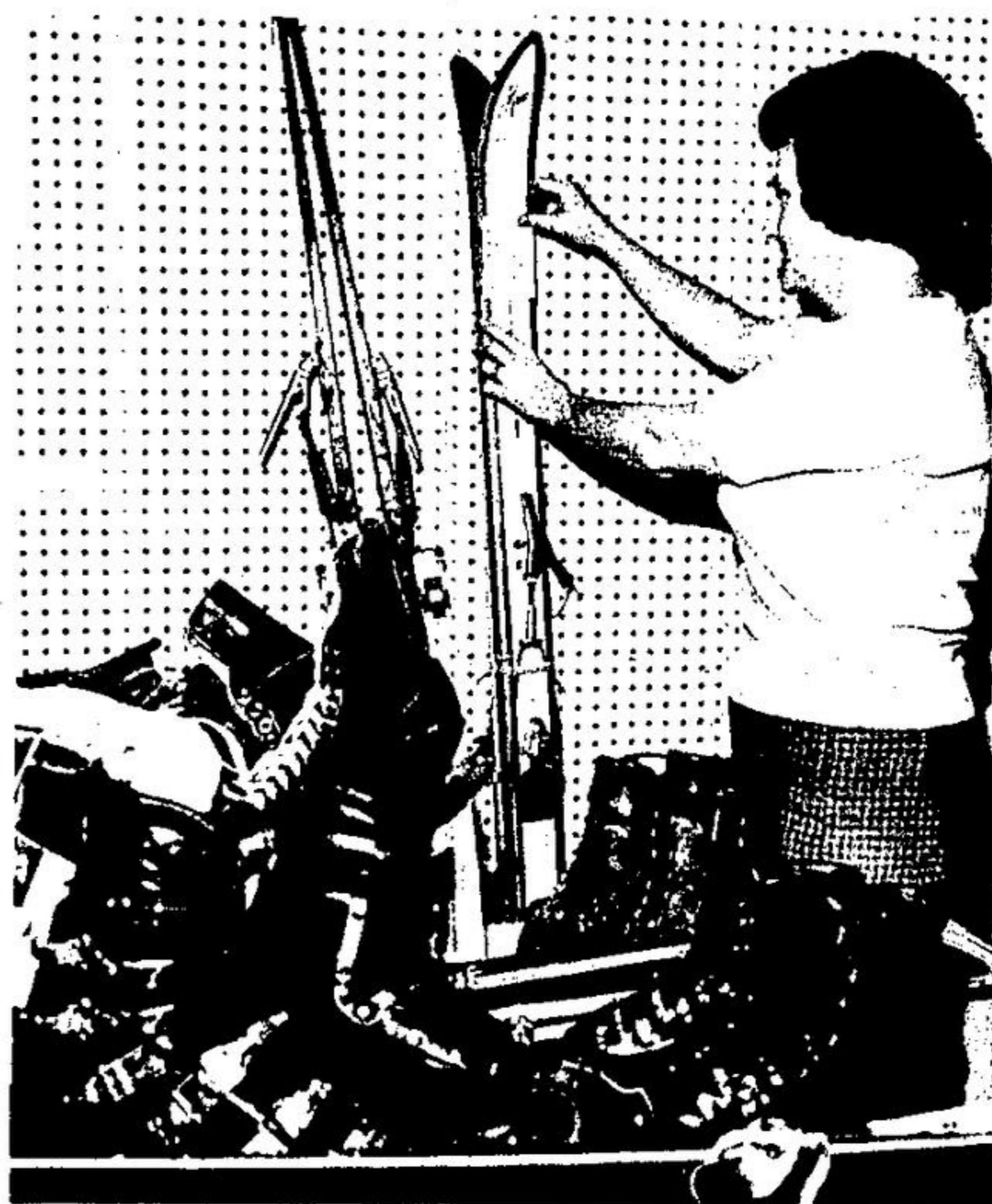
No building permits for houses were issued in November within the town limits. So far this year 50 house permits totalling \$968,579, have been issued.

Zorge Construction was issued a permit amounting to \$365,000 for the senior citizens apartments to be built at Sargent Road and Mountainview.

The only industrial permit went to Twin-Cee Ltd. on Armstrong Avenue for additional office and warehouse space. The permit was listed at \$52,000.

Despite the wintry weather, three swimming pool permits were issued last month.

Permits for the month totalled \$454,315 and for the year so far, \$4,121,018. The town collected \$10,301 in fees.
