McMenemy and manager Hugh Williams who did a great job with the team in the absence of coach Dave McMenemy.

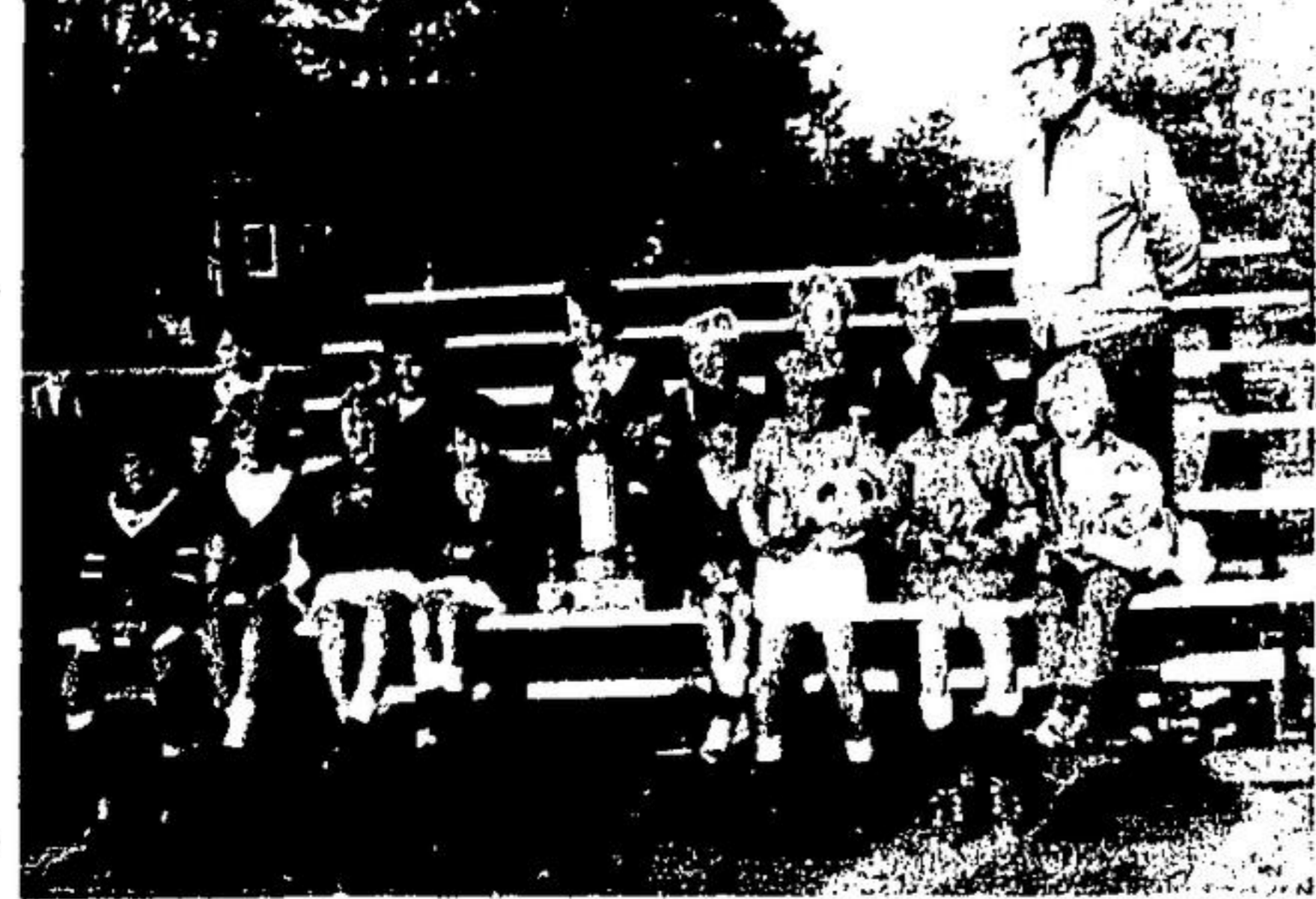
Jan Popiel Named To WHA All-Stars
