They were RR2 Hillsburgh residents. Mr. Tobias was a bassoon player with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra. The Tobias car was northbound when in collision with a southbound car driven by Fred Boulton of London. He and his wife Bonnie escaped with minor injuries.

### It's Settled GO Trains Will Bed Down in Railway Yard

The controversy about where the GO train will bed down on C.N. property immediately north of the railway station in Georgetown. A letter to this effect from the Ministry of Transportation and Communication was sent to both Georgetown and Esqueping councils. There will be no noise or pollution through the night, as was feared by many residents, since wayside power and heated buildings will be provided, allowing the shut-down of locomotives and auxiliary engines. Sixth Line residents who had been vocal in their opposition to proposed sites between the Sixth and Seventh Lines, will be relieved at this choice. Esqueping council opposed the lay-over sites in their township right from the beginning. Georgetown council advocated a location in the industrial area or in the general area which has now been chosen.
