## Coxe Lashes Out at Conservation Group's "Dictatorial Attitude"

Credit Valley Conservation Authority was attacked for their "dictatorial attitude" by Deputy-Reeve Len Coxe at Esqueping council's inaugural meeting, Wednesday. The Authority granted permission to B. Carney of Norval to erect a storage shed, but the permit stated it was done under protest, since the building was already under construction. The Authority said the township should not have granted a building permit without referring the matter to them. They emphasized the permit would not be granted at all if it was living accommodation, and would not be responsible for any flood damage. The Authority claims the area is floodland. The statement concluded by saying they were dissatisfied with the township's method of handling the matter.

Reeve Tom Hill barked, "For the price of paying for a roof over the whole Grand River." When Clerk treasurer Delmar French pointed out Esqueping's share was only \$194, the reeve retorted, "I don't care if it's only a penny." Council agreed with a suggestion by Cr. Dick Howitt that the municipalities should be advised of projected expenditures before the decision is made. The clerk was instructed to write them accordingly.
