## TOWN COUNCIL BRIEFS

A gallant action by Mark Osborne, of the town works force, was commended by council, Thursday night.

A letter from the town engineer asked council to authorize him to pay \$150 to Osborne for the loss of a coat, when he covered an accident victim last month. The accident was at Guelph and Armstrong Avenue.

Council okayed the expenditure, after Cr. Roy Booth suggested all work force members be allowed to take first aid training.

Council endorsed a motion by the Association of Municipalities of Ontario supporting them in opposition to the request by Bell Canada Ltd. for approval of increased rates.

The resignation of Harry Moss from the Cemetery Board was accepted.

The licence of N. Humenick to operate a billiard parlour at 16 Main Street North was renewed for 1973.

Membership in the Association of Rural Municipalities was renewed for 1973, and the fee of \$15 was approved.

Council authorized the final payment of \$4,576 to John Cucci Ltd. for the reconstruction of Delrex Blvd. from Edward to Sargent.

Mayor Bill Smith told council the hydro commission is considering underground wiring in all road projects in the future so want to be informed of proposed road work.
