Query 30% Conservation Cost Jump

A \$4,000 increase in Georgetown's share of conservation area costs in 1973, has caused concern in town council.

Last year Credit Valley Conservation Authority billed the town for \$14,000. CVAS has advised that this year they will probably require \$18,000.

Discussing this at a finance committee meeting Monday, chairman, Reeve Ric Morrow, said that while he is not unduly perturbed about the amount in dollars, he queries a 30 percent increase in the requisition.

TOKEN PROTEST "If we had to increase every item in our budget by this percentage," he said, "the town treasury would be facing disaster."

The town is required to pay whatever assessment CVAS makes, and can only make a token protest.

Reeve Morrow had agreement from his committee that council ask the Authority to reconsider its estimates. SECOND LOOK "I'm not saying we won't pay," he remarked. "Just asking them to take a second look."

"We objected to last year's assessment," said Cr. Ernest Sykes. "We said we wouldn't pay, and then were the first to do so."
