EMBARASSING
Howitt claimed he was placing the council and Planning Board in an embarrassing position since they had publicly stated they would designate existing land as they were, and amendments would be made later. "Just to designate your clients land arbitrarily would be unfair," Howitt continued. "I have gone on record saying this, you are asking me to fly in the face of these ratepayers," he concluded.

"The whole thing hinges on whether it was used as an extractive industry before the Official Plan was drawn up," Reeve Tom Hill remarked.

SOME QUALMS
Deputy-reeve Len Cox admitted he had some qualms about holding things up so long. "We could end up with egg on our face, by losing desirable assessment," he commented. Jennings asked that a meeting with the company, council, and the province be set up.

Cox said he was willing to meet with anyone if it would speed up the plan.

GET THINGS GOING
Reeve Tom Hill agreed he would like to see something done. "Not only for you," he said to Jennings, "but for a lot of other people who want to get things going in the township."

Council will try to arrange a meeting with the provincial representatives. "If they quit changing people around down there, you we know who's who," added reeve Tom Hill.
