Halton Buffalo Will Be Sold to The Sault

A yearling buffalo belonging to Halton Region Conservation Authority will be sold to Sault Ste. Marie. That city had two buffalo until Christmas when someone shot the bull. The price tag will come to about \$350 plus shipping charges according to Authority general manager Murray Stevens. It was almost eight years ago that the Authority brought a buffalo bull and four buffalo cows to a special 80-acre wildlife compound at the foot of Rattlesnake Point Conservation Area. "There's a surplus of bull around here anyway," said Authority chairman Ron Harris as he agreed to the sale.
