Find 36 Species
During Count**

Georgetown and District Naturalist Club had their annual bird count December 31. Cold 30 degree temperatures and murky skies hampered avid birders from achieving a high tally. Fifteen members participated in the event counting 1008 birds and 36 different species.

Unusual and migratory birds, which for some reason hadn't gone south for the winter, were four Mourning Doves, seven Boreal Chickadees, three Horned Larks, and an Oregon Junco. Robbings are commonly seen during the event, but this year the club saw only one traditional sunbather destined to forsake his nature and be snow bound.

A circular area of seven and a half miles surrounding Georgetown, from as far north as Terra Cotta to Hornby south of Georgetown was divided and surveyed in the sun rise to sun set bird count.

The club is affiliated with the Federation of Ontario Naturalists. There are 45 members who meet the second Tuesday of every month at the Knox Presbyterian Church. Members are also concerned with other aspects of conservation, writing letters to the minister of Natural Resources on the subject of humane trapping.

The bird count has in the past been forwarded to a provincial survey stemming from Waterloo, but no plans have been made in this respect for this year's endeavor.

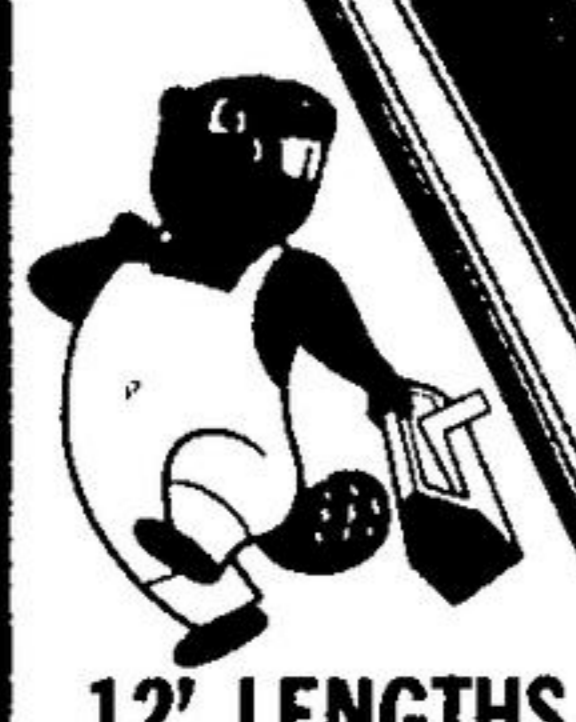
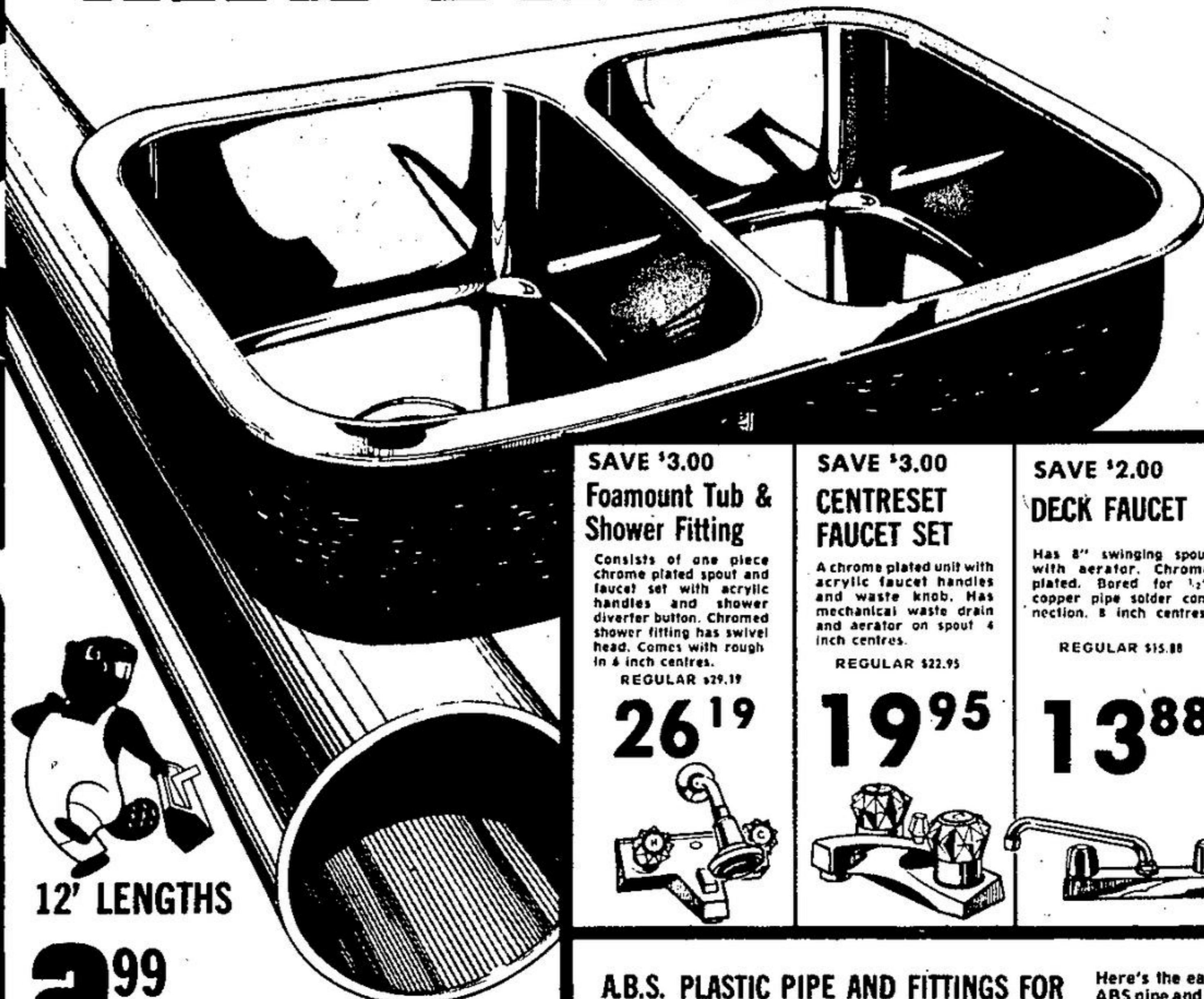

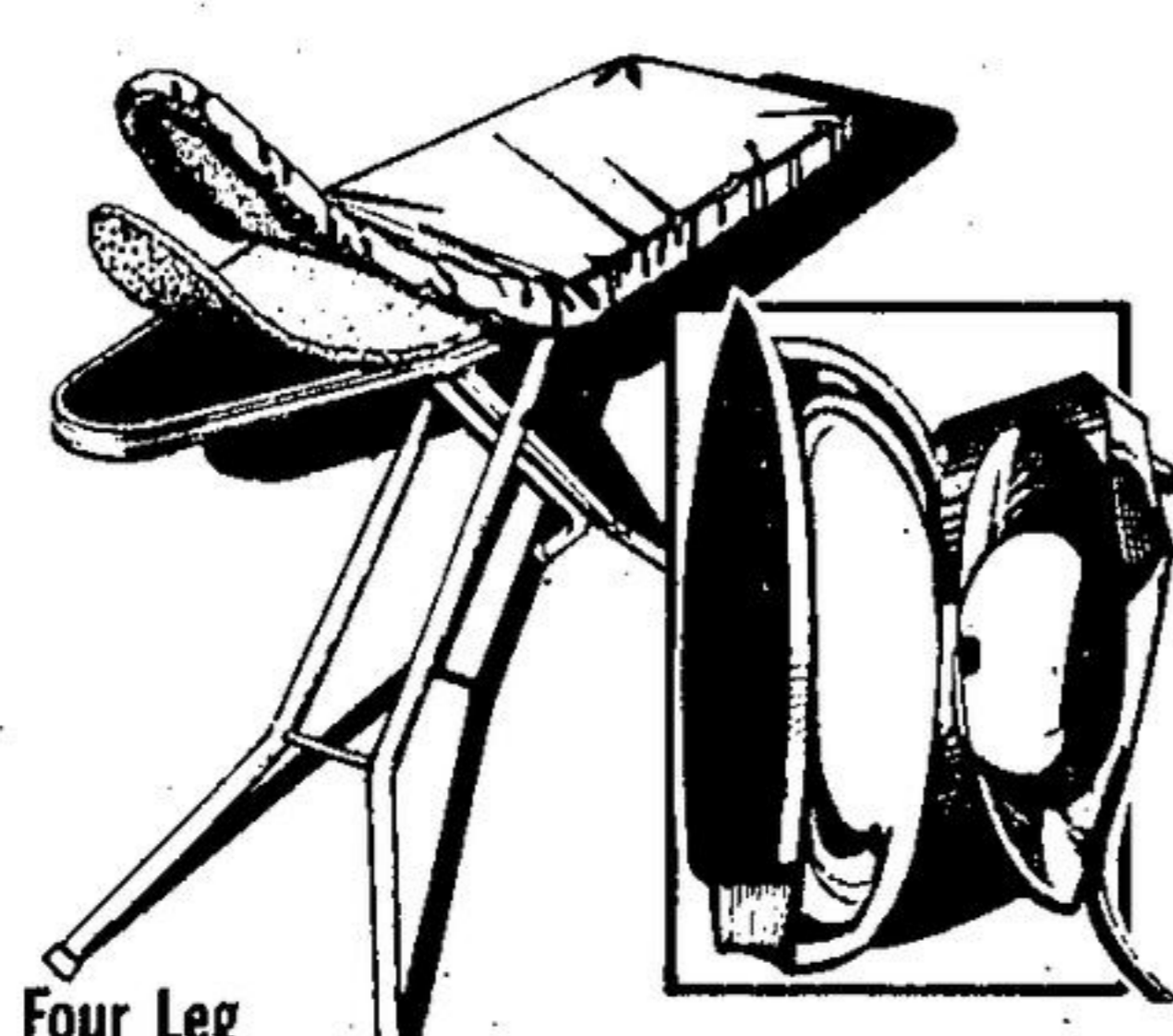
