Injuries Minor In Seven Motor Accidents

A rear end collision at the traffic lights at Maple and Guelph, January 18, at 3.30 p.m. crumpled the trunk lid, bumper and tail lights of a '72 Hornet, driven by Gail Wade, 37 Shelley Street. The '72 Chev driven by Robert Brown, of Guelph escaped damage.
