Legs, Back Injured When Pinned Between Vehicles

Six year old Deborah McConnell, 41 Chelvin Drive, escaped with cuts and bruises when she was struck by a car on Delrex Boulevard, Thursday afternoon at 4 o'clock. She was taken to Georgetown hospital by her mother, Mrs. D. McConnell, and later released.
The car a '72 Mazda was driven by Barbara Jones, 38 Metcalfe Court.
Henry Helfant, owner of Henry's Clothing Store, was taken to hospital Tuesday morning, suffering from bruises to his legs and an injured back, after his parked car rolled back and pinned him between the car and a parked truck, as he walked between them. They were parked outside his Main Street store. He was carried into Caruso's Fruit Market until the ambulance arrived.

The intersection of Guelph and Mountainview was the scene of an accident, Tuesday January 23, at 7:30 p.m., when a '64 Chev. driven by Keith Barber, 9 King Street East, and a '69 G.M.C. truck, driven by

William Burt, Lot 25, Con. 7 collided. Damage to the Chev amounted to \$400 and the truck \$100.
Friday, January 26, was a big day for accidents in town, with six reported.
A three car rear end pile-up resulted in one car nearly wrecked and two others damaged, Friday night at 8:30.
The accident at Queen and Guelph Streets, resulted in \$800 damage to the front end of a '70 Plymouth driven by Rex Cook, 29 Henry Street. \$2,500 damage to the front and rear of the middle car, a '71 Ventura, driven by Eugene Inglis, 7 Normandy Blvd., and \$25 damage to the taillights of a '65 Chev. driven by William Humphreys, 28 Prince Charles Drive.

Friday morning at Guelph and Brucewood, another accident happened. The '67 Chev. driven by Allan Ails, 72 Windsor Road was stopped prior to entering Guelph Street from the I.G.A. parking lot when he was struck by a '68 Chev driven by Robert MacLeod, 18 Edward Street, who was driving on Guelph Street. \$300 damage was done to the MacLeod car, and \$450 to the Ails car.
Also on Friday morning, at 10 o'clock, an accident occurred at Guelph and Maple. The '68 Meteor driven by Betty Helfant, 4 Delrex Blvd., had the rear bumper, body and fender crumpled to the tune of \$150 while the front bumper, grill and radiator of the '70 Ford driven by Kenneth McMillan, 60 Maple Avenue East received \$500 damage.

Again on Friday, at 12:40 p.m., two cars tangled in the Georgetown Market Centre parking lot, opposite the Canadian Tire entrance. The front right bumper, fender, hood and rad of the '72 Pinto driven by Graham Kemp of Burlington had an estimated \$800 damage, while the '71 Marquis, driven by Robert Nelson, of Con. 7 Escaping, escaped with \$50 damage to the left front fender.

Okay Septic Waste for Sewage Plant

Requests for disposal of waste materials from out-of-town sources into Georgetown's sewage treatment plant were discussed at a council works committee meeting Monday.
Halton Sanitation Services, a Glen Williams firm, wants to dump septic tank wastes into the system.
A letter from the Ministry of Environment says that this would not affect the operation of the Georgetown plant, and town engineer Eric Willis agrees with this finding.
SUGGEST FEE
The committee seemed in agreement that this could be allowed, and suggested a fee of \$10 per load to cover the town's costs.
The committee also discussed a request from Beaumont Knitting Co. Ltd. of Glen Williams. The firm wants to dispose of effluent from its washing operations into the town's treatment plant.

Seek Solution To Congestion Market Entrance

The Mountainview Road Centre is becoming more congested.
Discussing this Monday council's works committee will look for a solution, and has asked the plaza owners to attend the next committee meeting.
Traffic in the plaza has increased in the last year, since a large addition was completed, and Canadian Tire and the liquor store have relocated there.
Ern Hyde said a new entrance should be considered, perhaps halfway down Mountainview, between Campbell Gate and Sargent Road.
Town engineer Eric Willis favours an entrance at an intersection, and said Sargent Road would be his choice.
He said that as traffic increases, traffic lights would eventually be required, and Sargent Road would be a logical place for these.
