O'Connor Says Prices Committee May Create **Panic Price Increases**

Royal commissions and investigative committees have done little to solve Canadian problems and, in some instances have contributed to inflation. Terry O'Conner (PC-Halton) argued in the Commons last week.

Making his maiden speech during debate on establishment of a committee to investigate food prices, Mr. O'Connor said the existence of such committees may tend to create panie price increases in anticipation of coming controls. He said his party was not optimistic that the grudging acknowledgment by the government of the inflation problem would solve anything. However, in an effort to get some beneficial results the Conservatives had moved amendments to eliminate Senate representation, to limit the sitting time of the committee and to restrict committee travel and the use of outside support staff.
