Rehabilitate (Continued from Page 1) backfilling operations would not be offensive to our neighbours and our employees".

NO INCREASE He added that the company would hope to benefit as well as the public generally. He pointed out there would be little or no increase in truck traffic, since the trucks would come into Toronto with aggregate, and return with the compacted bales, instead of returning empty, as they do now. He emphasized that the plan to use

the site was subject to the approval of Esquesing township and other local and provincial bodies. The landfill site meets the requirements of the Ontario Department of the Environment. In addition Anglo Recycling will be entering into a joint research program with the Province of Ontario to study further recycling possibilities for the portion which is not recyclable at this time.

ASTEP In a letter to Robert Billingsley, president of Anglo Recycling, the Minister, James Auld, Minister of the Environment, gave his support to the system and said, "your company's solid waste system is a step in the direction of a full solution". He said it was particularly important that it was a full scale plant which could be operational by the end of 1973. The proposal was also en-dorsed by Pollution Probe who said they were delighted to see a private company taking the initiative in doing something about the increasing quantities of solid waste being generated, and the recycling of as much as

possible. A. G. Borud, divisional manager of Indusmin Quarries, told Esquesing council, last week wells would be drilled all around the area for monitoring of the water supply, in cooperation with the Ontario

Water Resources Commission. Reeve Tom Hill would make no comment on the proposal immediately, but said he would wait till he could talk it over with the council. "Everything is being done out in the open, the way it should be", was his only statement.
