The public will first learn of the legislation when it is introduced at Queen's Park for the first reading sometime in early May. Prior to public awareness the legislation will pass through management board of cabinet, policy and priorities committee at cabinet, legislation committee, cabinet. and government caucus.

At the early stages of the movement of the legislation through the first reading lawyers in the government offices check the legal wording of the bill. The legislation receives the green light for approval in principle when it passed the policies and priorities committee.

Following first reading the bill will remain on the order paper for about two weeks. During this time all members of the legislature will have an opportunity of studying the bill in view of making any necessary amendments.
