

BAIL REFORM The Bail Reform resolution

(1) The law requiring on the

street bail (court appearance notices) be repealed. (2) All persons deserving of bail shall be bailed from police stations by the officer in charge of the station or a Justice of the

(3) The onus of proving eligibility for bail for those charged with a serious crime shall rest with the accused person and not the Crown. (4) Person on ball shall be

prohibited from being bailed for subsequent charges. (5) A central data bank be established to assist law enforcement and courts so that persons on bail will be further

considered for bail.

TWO MAN PATROL The two man patrol car resolution, originally intended just for Metro is being picked up by other areas. It also states all police officers shall be armed when in uniform. This could cover going to and from

PAROLE The resolution on parole

(1) First offenders shall not become eligible for parole until they have served at least one half of their sentence as determined by the court
