Dear Terry:

I would like to make a few comments and observations as one of your constituents.

I feel that the death penalty should be mandatory in cases of first degree murder of all people inot only prison guards and policemen), Aircraft Hijackers, Kidnappers, and Drug Peddlers. If this was so, our country would be a better place to live in. I also feel that the cabinet should not commute these death penalties imposed by the
