World War Vet Farmed In Albion

An R.R.1 Georgetown resident since 1965, Frederick Oscar Maw, 70, died in Georgetown hospital February 13.

Mr. Maw was born in Albion Township in 1895, son of Frederick Peter and Margaret Speirs Maw. He farmed there all his life until his retirement, with the exception of three years' army service in World War I. He received the British War Medal for his service overseas. He was a member of the Royal Canadian Legion branch in Bolton.

His wife, Mary Burrell, whom he married in 1931, died in 1956. He leaves three children, Linwood of R.R.1 Georgetown, William, R.R.5 Bolton and Mrs. A. Brodyell (Barthol), Caledon East, two grandchildren, and a sister, Mrs. Lyman Davis (Edith) of Nobleton. Three brothers predeceased him, William, Seaward and Thomas.
