**The Task Force on Workmen's Compensation Board, Ontario**

The Task Force appointed by the Government of the Province of Ontario to study and report on the administrative practices of the Workmen's Compensation Board is seeking the views of the public, as they relate to its terms of reference.

The terms of reference of the study include the following:

- The management and administrative structure and practices of the Workmen's Compensation Board - including its methods of adjudication.
- Whether "rehabilitation" services, including the Workmen's Compensation Board hospital and its job finding program, could effectively be provided under contract to outside organizations.
- The relationship of the Board to the Ministry of Labour.
- The safety functions of the Board and the Ministry of Labour.
- The composition, size and responsibilities of the Board, itself.
- The role of the Workmen's advisers.
- Retirement benefits and attendance credits for employees and Board members.

Written submissions are welcomed by the Task Force While the deadline for written submissions is March 30, the Task Force would appreciate receiving the submissions earlier if it is possible.
