

Knight - McFarlane Duo Have the Winning Habit

Last weekend, the Georgetown snowmobile racing team of Alan Knight and Ned McFarlane won first place twice in the Ontario Snowmobile Racing Federation, B Sanction races in Uxbridge. Al drove their Thunderjet with its all magnesium Yamaha engine, 292 c.c. single cylinder, to victory in the A Modified race on Saturday and again on Sunday.

The track was well groomed. The team's Thunderjet averaged 65 to 70 miles per hour around the track. Alan Knight and Ned McFarlane both in their early twenties and residents of Georgetown have been racing as a team for the last two years. They have won competitions throughout Southern Ontario and have a score of trophies to show for it.

Some of the more recent ones are for the open modified at Drumquinn, the A Modified and open Modified at Wasaga Beach, and fourth prize in Guelph two weekends ago.

The team has the support and co-operation of Dave Armstrong of Armstrong's Garage where Al Knight works. Dave helps with the conditioning of the Thunderjet. Fred Decey, Yamaha Ltd. helps supply the team.
