During the years since the end of World War 2 billions of dollars have been given to the poorer nations of the world. In spite of this, the poor get poorer and the rich get richer. Average per capita income in Canada is \$2,850, while in Tanzania it is \$70, why? The first reason is because we give with so many conditions attached to our gifts. Over 80 percent of international aid is "tied aid", which means the receiving country must buy what the giver wants him to - often what is not really needed. This keeps the developing nations in a state of dependence, not able to assert their own ideas or characteristics. Just as God created man in his image, so we are trying to shape the nations of the third world in our image. But this should not be.

The second reason the gap between the rich and poor is widening is because we are essentially only interested in our-selves. We have the money and the power and therefore force on others trade agreements which benefit us. Then we give small amounts to them in charity so that we feel good (and Christian!) and they feel like second class citizens.

OUR GAME, OUR RULES

A third reason that the gap has become wider is because many countries have been duped into playing our 'game' with our rules. Their own rich social and cultural values are sacrificed in favour of the overpowering economic values of the affluent nations. But in the game of "money, money, who has the money" they never have it.

From March 9-19 most of the churches in Canada are cooperating in sponsoring an educational program called "Ten Days for World Development." Unlike most other Lenten campaigns of the past, is not primarily a program to raise money. It will attempt to help us fulfill the first requirement of world development -- understanding. This is so important that many people are saying that it is better not to give at all than to give without understanding. Our ignorance of the real needs of people means that we increase their misery when we give what we think they need.

GIVE UP 'DO-GOODISM'

In this modern world of developing nations the Church can play a significant role, but we must give up our 'do-goodism'. paternalistic attitudes. We live in a world of big business and political struggle, but many of the leaders of these companies or countries are also concerned people. They are not completely deaf to the Word of God for our day - unless it is not spoken. We must learn, we must be concerned and we must speak of God's love for all people.

The man who picks the coffee we drink, the bananas we eat, the sugar we use, receives but a few cents a day for his labour. We are dependent on him for our food, so it is our responsibility to see that he is fairly paid for his labour.
