**REPORT**  
Infrequently police officers are asked two questions in a most incorrect way. These questions are:  
1. How do I get a driver's licence?  
2. How many points do I lose for this or that offence?  
For many people the answer to the first question will be simple and obvious. You must successfully pass various examinations and tests before you earn your driver's licence. Most people realize that they must earn the privilege to possess a driver's licence. A driver's licence is not mailed out to everyone as a right but must be earned.  
In relation to the second question, contrary to popular belief you do not lose points for any offence. You earn your points. Therefore, if you commit a traffic offence for which demerit points are provided you have earned the respective points.  
When you have earned 6 points you will receive a warning letter urging you to improve your driving habits.  
When you have earned 9 points you will receive a letter requiring you to attend at a personal interview to discuss your driving record and give reasons why your driver's licence should not be suspended. You may be placed on probation or have your licence suspended if the interviewers decide that your attitude shows indifference to your responsibilities as a driver.  
When you have earned 12 points you will be required to attend at another interview and give explicit reasons why your licence should not be suspended immediately.
