province. "The Blue book" suggested four from north Halton, but the brief urged five. The election of regional representatives by ward or at large proved to be the only controversial part of the brief. After a lengthy debate Mayor Bill Smith had to cast the deciding vote, and the vote was for election by the ward system. While the wards are not yet established, it was agreed the wards should be fairly equal in population, and would probably result in two wards in Georgetown and the other two split north-south along some line in Esquevas with Acton being contained within one of them.

**PER CAPITA**  
Tackling the question of the sharing of industrial assessment on a regional basis, the brief included a motion passed by council, stating that the benefit of all industrial assessment in the region be shared among the area municipalities on a per capita basis, and not through equalized assessment in order to eliminate the scramble for industrial assessment. The resolution will be sent to all municipalities in Halton and Peel for endorsement.

The local or area council as seen by the Georgetown brief, would have 17 members, four of them regional, but also members of the local council, and three councillors from each of the four wards, plus the mayor. Reeve Ric Morrow questioned the size feeling it was unwieldy but Cr. Roy Booth pointed out how many nights councillors are busy now, only looking after Georgetown. "A smaller number couldn't do it," he remarked.

**LOCAL LANDFILL**  
Council took a determined stand on responsibility for garbage collection and disposal. Under landfill practices, collection and disposal would be entirely local so that disposal sites will be located within the area of origin. If any regional disposal site is established, area municipalities at their own option should be permitted to utilize them, or operate their own disposal site. "We are completely opposed to any area municipality having regional landfill sites imposed on them, and against potentially heavy collection and delivery costs of local garbage to regionally determined disposal sites," said the brief.

**NAME CONTEST**  
Cr. Ern Hyde suggested a competition to name the new northern area should be carried out in the schools, with a winner chosen whether that ever becomes the final name of the area. Mayor Bill Smith suggested each municipality should suggest a name, then it be included on the ballot, so the voters could choose. Cr. Phil Siddal said he would like to see "the lovely name of Esquevas" preserved. The brief will also be presented to a county wide seminar for municipal councillors on Thursday.
