Grass Fires Costly

Georgetown this week had its first two grass fires of the season. Last year out of 126 fires made by the Georgetown Fire Department 41 were grass fires. Fire Chief Ken Buikema says these fires are listed as no loss, but it ties up equipment and takes men away from their regular jobs, it being a volunteer department, and someone has to pay for it.

Open burning is illegal under a provincial law, and the administration of the law is carried out by the Air Management Branch. However, it is nearly impossible to catch people lighting such fires, says Ken Buikema, and the Air Management Branch has to do with apprehensions of the culprits.

This law means that the fire department cannot issue burning permits, as they did five years ago. The fines for such fires are \$1,000 for individuals and \$5,000 for corporations.

It is still legal to have a campfire in the appropriate location, however, the material you burn must be clean, dry wood and grass, and not of any quantity. A campfire must be tended at all times.

Mr. Buikema states that a grass fire can spread over a hundred acres in no time at all. People tending an illegal fire should have a source of water and a rake or shovel. Fires that get out of control are fires that are not tended, and not properly put out.

Common causes of fire calls concerning grass fires are people burning off spring debris, grass and brush; camp fires and discarded cigarettes. These fires delay fire equipment getting to major fires of buildings etc., says Chief Buikema. When the Georgetown department is out on call, the Acton or another municipal department have to fill in, causing additional expense.
