### Anglers Should Be Checking The Equipment

March 14 was an important day for me, as far as I was concerned spring was officially here, two robins in our back yard told me so.

On March 27 at approximately 7:15 p.m. the sky on the horizon was still pinkish from the sunset.

**EARLY RUN**

Fishermen should be checking their tackle for worn lines, loose rod guides and worn ones. A badly cut guide, especially one on the tip, can quickly cut the nylon line.
