Alternate Route For Tower Trail, End of Month

Bruce Howlett, the consultant retained by the Solandt Commission, will announce alternate routes for the Nanticoke to Pickering hydro corridor towards the end of April. More than 100 farmers, environmentalists and residents from Peel and Halton counties heard Mr. Howlett make this disclosure at a public meeting at Bramalea's Victoria Park recreation centre Thursday night.

Mr. Howlett said that the final route preferred will be recommended to the Solandt Commission sometime during the latter part of May or early June. He also added that there was no possible route without some kind of environmental impact.

At the meeting were maps containing all the collected relevant information of environmental impact etc., for the area of Wentworth, Wellington, Peel and Halton counties with the others towards Oshawa and Pickering.

NOT OVERSHADOWED
It was stated that the 14,000 questionnaires sent out would be taken into account, and members of the Peel County Federation were reassured that they would not be overshadowed by environmentalists. This was the subject of an earlier brief from the federation, who felt they would suffer because of the environmentalists being better organized.

The hydro corridor will be 610 feet wide and hold three 5,000 volt line towers and two 2,000 volt line towers.

SUGGESTIONS
Following Mr. Howlett's speech, suggestions were heard from the floor as to alternate routes, using an under water line in Lake Ontario, the Parkway Belt etc.

This meeting was the second in a series of public meetings. There will be two more, the third when the alternate routes will be announced and a final one when the corridor route will be chosen.
