

# Present Pool, Arena, Hall Recommendations Tonight

Tonight a sub-committee will present recommendations to council regarding the construction of a pool, arena, and community hall plus other facilities deemed advantageous to be included in this package, a suitable site or sites for such facilities plus all related financial ramifications pertaining to the capital and operating cost of such facilities.

The sub-committee was formed at the request of council by the recreation committee, consisting of three members of the facilities committee and three members of the recreation committee, plus two resource personnel.

The members of the sub-committee are: Cr. William Hunter, Dean Taylor, Ed Eislinger, Robert Wakfer, Mike Marshall, Anthony Corbett, plus Doug Collison, recreation director, and Lou Broadfield as resource personnel. The presentation will be made to council's committee meeting of the whole.

**PRE-CAST QUICKER**  
Collison gave information re a letter sent to the town clerk administrator, Doug Pritchard from Cambrina Engineering Group Ltd.

**ACCOUNTS**  
Three resolutions were passed with respect to paying accounts. The first was general recreation accounts totalling \$9,990.62. The second, that the committee recommends that an account in the amount of \$35 to the Ontario Municipal Recreation Association for 1973 membership be paid. The final, account of \$15 be paid to the Royal Life Society of Canada for 1973 affiliation.

The committee passed a resolution to recommend to council that a by-law be prepared prohibiting parking on the west side of the arena driveway. The topic of traffic obstruction at the arena has been a problem discussed by the committee at past meetings.

**STAFF JACKETS**  
The committee expressed their feelings that it would be advantageous to the general public using the arena, if the arena staff wore jackets which were created with Georgetown Arena. It was moved that the Recreation, Parks and Community Centres Committee agree to pay one-half of the cost of jackets, to be used by full and part time staff at the arena with a maximum contribution of \$100.

**BUDGET APRIL 10**  
The 1973 recreation budget was once again delayed, the meeting running late into the night. April 10 will be the budget meeting night. Ed Eislinger asked about affiliation between community groups and the recreation

committee. Collison stated that letters have been sent to all

community organizations. This will be discussed at a later date.
