## Car Hits Tree, Pole Saturday

An accident at the entrance to Georgetown Market Centre April 3, at 8:30 p.m., caused a total of \$1,400 damage, when cars driven by Michael Hume, of 83 Raylawn Crescent and Karen Burt, of 321 Delrex Blvd. collided.

The Hume car, a '68 Dodge received \$200 to the front, and the Burt car, a '66 Volkswagen, \$1,200 to the rear.

Guelph Street near the entrance to the Canadian Tire Gas Bar was the scene of an accident, April 8, at 5:20 p.m. The '70 Ford driven by James Miller of Hexdale had damage to the right front fender, and bumper amounting to \$100 and the '71 Mazda, driven by Neil Dempster, 18, of 158 Mountainview South had \$250 damage to the left rear fender, tail light and trunk lid.

Losing control of his car on the curve at Main Street North and Highway 7, by Ontario Street, April 14, at 9:15 p.m. resulted in \$950 damage to the '68 Dodge driven by William McCandless, 24 Ransom Street, Acton.

The car, northbound on Main Street North, left the road, struck a tree, brushed a hydro pole, and came back onto the median strip. The car left the road again, and travelled along the shoulder for 158 feet before coming to a stop.

A rear end collision at the Guelph and Mountainview intersection resulted in \$125 damage to the '67 Chrysler driven by Albert Clark, 529 Guelph Street, Glen Williams, and \$175 damage to the '64 Plymouth driven by Donald Ellis, Acton. The accident happened April 10 at 3:30 p.m.

### One a Day Rate For Grass Fires

Georgetown firemen fought seven grass fires this week. Two grass fires occurred April 12, one at Main Street South and 15 Sideroad, and the other in the ravine behind Chipper Court.

April 14, two more grass fires were extinguished. The 10th Line opposite Georgetown Golf Club was the scene of the first, and Highway 7, one mile north of town, the scene of the second. The following day, April 5, firemen fought two more grass fires, one at the south end of Market Street and one at Joseph Street in Glen Williams.

Another grass fire, on the 6th Line north of 22 Sideroad called firemen to the scene April 17.

Burning garbage behind Young's Pharmacy was quickly extinguished April 14, at 8:45 p.m.

Firemen hosed down a car and the surrounding ground, April 16, when gas was spotted leaking from a car in the municipal parking lot.
