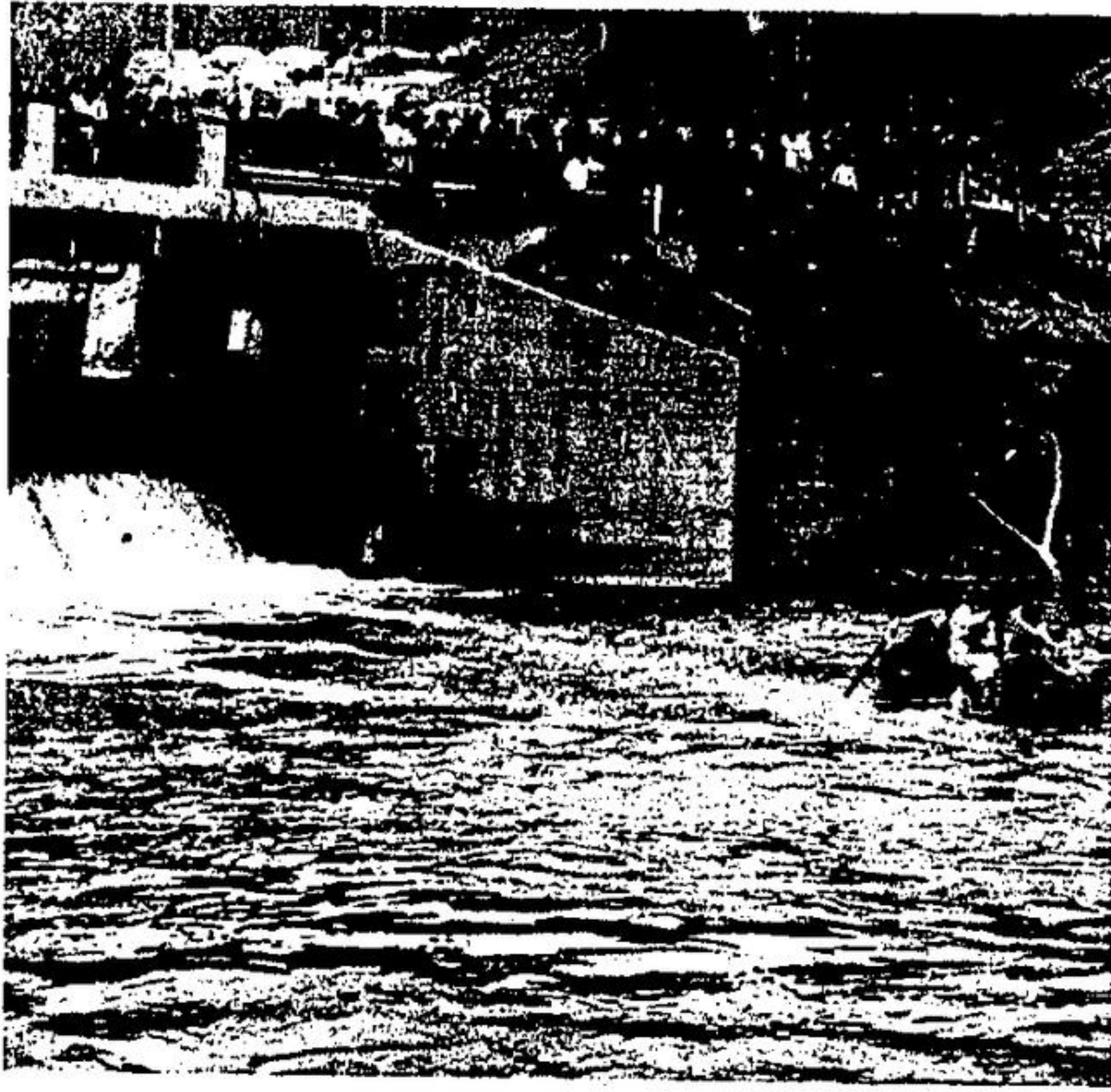


CREDIT RIVER OVERFLOW

Three weeks ago, the Town of Georgetown created a new position in its executive and hired Mario Pasquale Venditti, York University Urban Geography graduate, to fill that position of committee secretary.

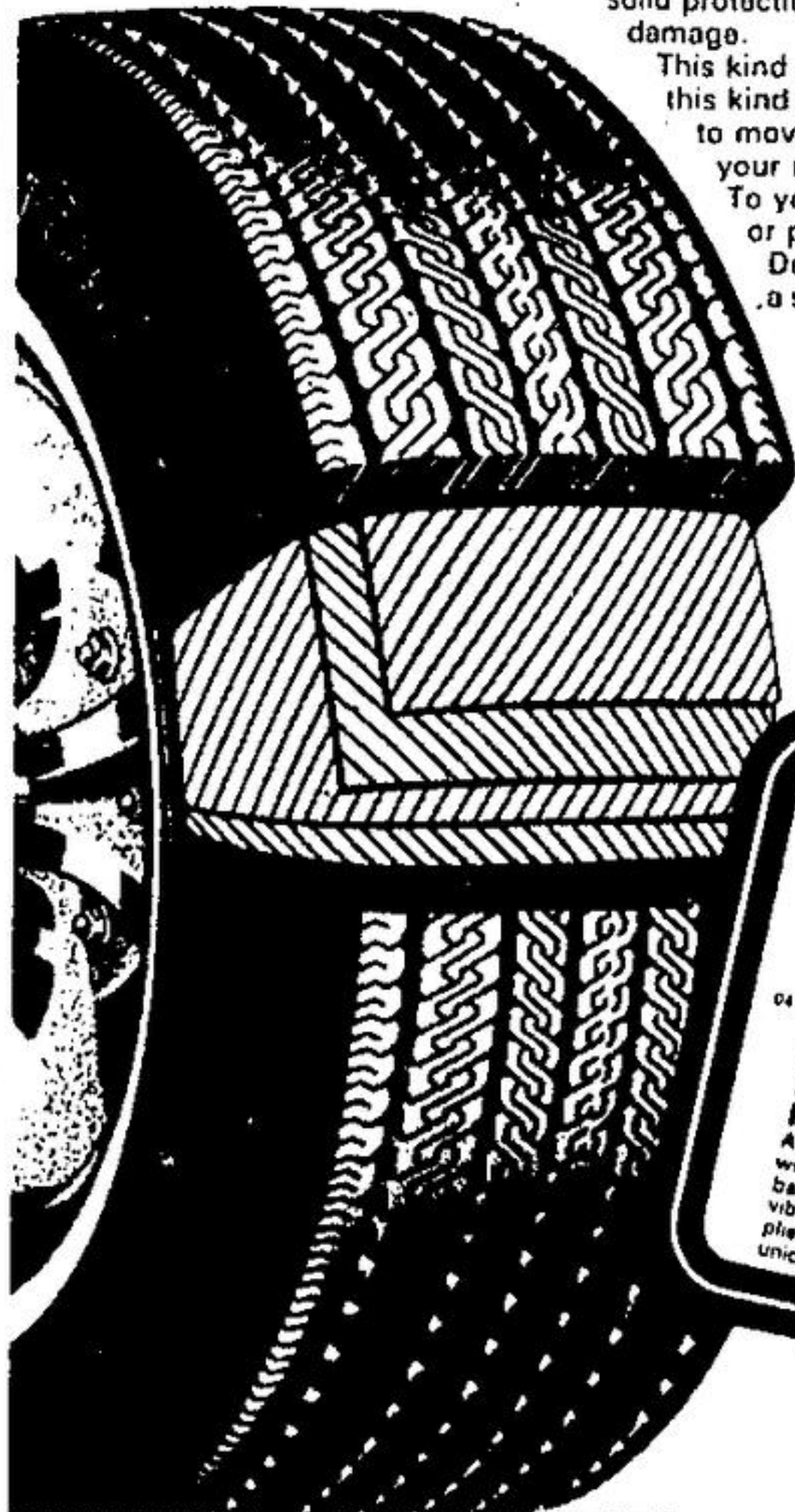
