Parents Persist

School Board Will Look at "French Immersion"

The Halton County Board of Education backed off Thursday from its rejection of a proposed French immersion program for Halton school children. The board rescinded its motion of Feb. 22 putting an end to the program and agreed to reconsider the matter at its next meeting, April 26. The board will decide then whether to proceed with the program or scrap it.

Trustee Judy Alexander asked that the program be reconsidered because new facts have been unearthed since Feb. 22 and because a larger number of parents have shown interest in the program than was originally believed. Since original board rejection

of the plan, a group calling themselves the Oakville Parents for Bilingualism have solicited the names of 120 children whose parents want them enrolled in a French immersion program. Only 53 children were originally signed up for the program. The parents also prepared a brief stating their case and mailed to the trustees this week. The original recommendation to scrap the program came from the board's senior administrators, who estimated French immersion would cost \$4,650 extra for four kindergarten classes totalling 100 pupils.

When trustees first asked the administration to study the feasibility of French immersion last March, they laid down the condition that costs could not be any greater than in a regular program. Contained in the parents' brief are calculations showing that the provincial government would pay 60 percent of the costs, as it does for all educational expenditures. The brief also questions the \$4,650 estimate, suggesting several ways to trim that figure. The parents offered to pay for

165 Parents Urge Board Adopt F. I.

A delegation from the Oakville Parents for Bilingualism will attend the Halton Board of Education meeting tonight, to present a brief and make their support known concerning the French Immersion Program.

The program was defeated February 22 on the grounds that it would mean additional costs and there would not be the support needed. That motion was rescinded at the meeting April 12, when Mrs. J. Alexander stated a brief had been received from the Oakville Parents for Bilingualism. Letters had been received, and there had been reaction in the press as well.

LEAVE INFORMATION

Mrs. Norman Webster, and Mrs. Norman Young of Oakville and members of the parents' group were in Georgetown Monday leaving information on the program at centres where people can pick it up. Mrs. Norman Webster says "People don't really understand what French immersion is. It's a scary word."

The group hopes for the program to be instrumental in two schools in Burlington, two in Oakville and two in North Halton, in schools which have two kindergartens.

The program is as follows: Kindergarten will be conducted

entirely in French, and the same in grade one. In grade two the children will get some reading in English; in grades three and four classes will be 35 percent in English and 65 percent in French. In grades five and six it will be 50/50 and in seven and eight all English except for regular French review periods. This immersion program is

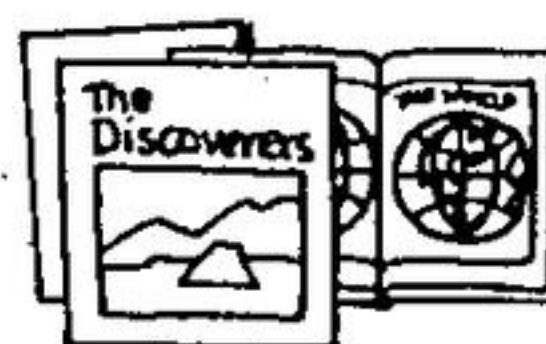

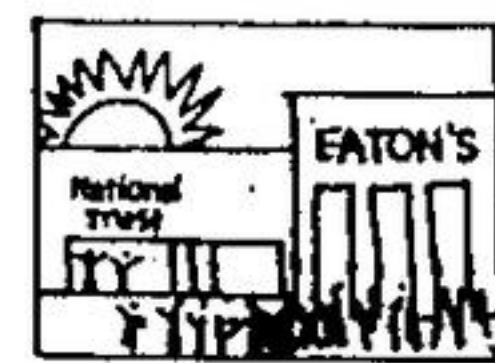

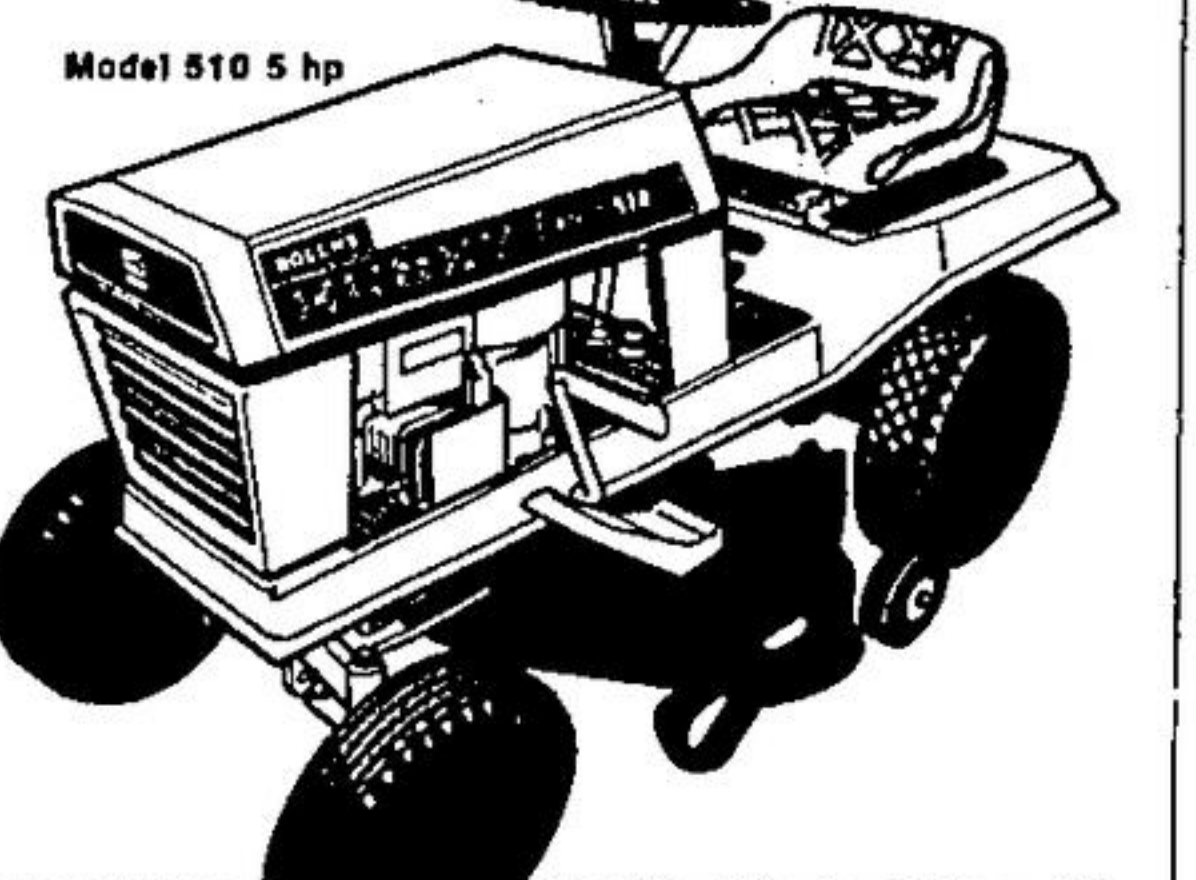
Expect 700 Rug Hookers at Show
