

### CLERGY COMMENT

### If Life's Not Inside It's False Growth

by REV. W. R. CAIRNS MOUNTAINVIEW BAPTIST CHURCH

I was terribly embarrassed. It should never have happened. But then, I'm human and not yet infallible, so I make mistakes. (Don't you envy those "perfect" people who are always so impeccable in all they do and say?). Anyway, I'm honest enough to admit again - and here I'm putting my confessions in print - I was so embarrassed that I even made my hostess laugh in my

Now what caused my abashment and confusion? Why did I even go red in the face and for once become lost for words? It was purely an error of judgment, a snap decision that proved to be

As I entered my friend's home (I was making a Pastoral visit) I was momentarily deceived, and thoughtlessly jumped to the conclusion that the beautiful array of flowers in the hallway were genuinely the result of God's handiwork. It was only when I had finished admiring them and had put my nose down to catch something of their fragrance that I realized that the bouquet came out of a factory and not from a garden.

But I've never forgotten that incident, nor have I made the same mistake again, even though it happened a good many year's ago in my first pastorate. But what is even more important, the humiliating experience gave me an idea for my next Sunday sermon, the theme being, "A False Growth."

Dr. Stanley Jones was a famous Missionary and writer who died quite recently. Listen to what the great man once said: "Growth in life is life's greatest adventure. The business of life is to live and live abundantly. Most people know everything about **CHRISTIAN REFORMED** life except how to live it - our souls are made for the soil of eternity. If they are planted only in the narrow framework of time they are not living in the climate for which they were

That is a tremendous statement and full of truth. Look around you today and you will see countless thousands of people who sincerely think they are "living it up" when the real truth of the matter is that they haven't yet begun to live.

MONEY AND MATERIALISM . Take the false growth of materialism, for instance. How many good, honest people all around us really believe they have got life because God has been good to them and blessed them with an abundance of this world's goods. Not that we are de-crying money or material substance. Far from it. But we must remember that Jesus once said: "Beware! Be on your guard against greed of every kind, for even when a man has more than enough, his wealth does not give life."(Luke 12:15).

How many young people today are deceived into believing that they have found life because they are living in a permissive society? How tragic! Walking along an English road one day my eye caught the

Thought for the Day" on a church notice board. It read: 'Beware of the fleeting pleasure with lasting shame." Would that our young people today would remember that the next time emptation looks them straight in the face. So many of them think hat they've grown up when in reality it is all a false growth. The Bible says: "But grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." Painting a dead tree with

green paint may give the impression of life. But life must be on he inside, otherwise there can be no growth. Jesus said: "I have come to give life . . . " Apart from Him there is no life and no spiritual growth.

Yes. I was embarrassed that day, but I was taught a spiritual lesson I've not forgotten.
