Mr. G. Cunningham of Glen Williams has joined the Foster Parents Plan. He has adopted Mai Huu Khanh, age eight, of Viet Nam.

Saigon where he attends a private school to learn spelling, writing and counting. The occupations of his three brothers and three sisters are weaver, rice merchant, carpenter's apprentice and three students. His father who has mental trouble, an uncle and an aunt live with him. His mother died on July 16, 1965.

Mr. Cunningham's monthly contribution will be \$17 a month to bring material and financial assistance to both child and family. This is aimed at strengthening the family unit by helping each member. There are nine members in this family.

Seventeen dollars a month provides this family with a monthly cash grant, distribution of goods such as vitamins, blankets, towels, soap and other useful items, medical and dental care, the sustained guidance and counselling of social workers and the benefit of special programs.

A strong emphasis is placed on education. All foster children (and their brothers and sisters if possible) must attend school. Vocational training courses are available to Foster Children, their brothers and sisters and in some cases their parents. The aim is to give the family the tools to help become independent and self-supporting. Special programs adapted to the needs of each country also meet these aims.

Foster Parents and Foster Children correspond monthly (letters are translated by PLAN). Foster Parents Plan is currently working in 10 countries in South America and Asia.

Over 50,000 children are currently being aided by individuals, groups and families in Canada, the U.S.A. and Australia. This non-profit, independent organization is located at 153 St. Clair Avenue West, Toronto 7.
