The rolloff consisted of six games. Bowlers from as far away as Chatham and Azilda participated.

In a great race for the girls' title, Marion Morse of Bar-Don Lanes, Stoney Creek averaged 232 for a six game total of 1456 to win. Miss Morse and Scarborough's Mary Ann Killins were running "neck and neck" going into the final game as only three pins separated the two. Miss Killins finished second with her total of 1424.

Georgetown's Wendy Bouskill, who was by far the youngest competitor placed third with 1353. She rolled the high single game for the girls with a 308 single.

An equally exciting race took place in the boys division. At the end of five games, Frank Strathearn of Victoria Bowl, Kitchener, was leading Gary Worrton of Bar-Don Lanes, Stoney Creek by only nine pins.
