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NOTICE
TOWN OF GEORGETOWN
At the request of the Council of the Town of Georgetown, the Ministry of the Environment has investigated the possibility of installing a sewerage system in the town of Georgetown. The proposed project would consist of sewerage works to be constructed as follows:

1. Extension of the existing 10" diameter sewerage treatment plant to an increased capacity from 15 to 10 MGD, and the addition of effluent polishing facilities, comprising automatic back wash filters, including all equipment and operation.

2. After allowing for the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation's contribution of \$300,000, the estimated annual cost of the project, which includes debt charges and interest, Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation's contribution, reserve for contingencies and operation costs is \$12,000. It is proposed to raise the sum by imposing a percent surcharge on the annual water bill of all users of the sewerage works system.

A typical home with a water bill of \$40.00 per annum will pay \$4.00 per annum for the sewerage works project. The sewerage works project will be completed by the end of 1973. The proposed project would consist of sewerage works to be constructed as follows:

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
