

Disturbed Teenagers Concerns QAS Director

Halton Children's Aid Society is facing the question of whether or not it should continue in its present role of protection and adoption or enter, as well, the field of prevention. The society's board of directors last week agreed to re-establish its family and children's service committee to study the subject. The committee hasn't been in use for about two years.

One of the roles of the newly-formed committee would be to recommend policies for prevention. Dr. Gordon Askwith, executive director, said at the board meeting there is a need for research on what can be done for seriously emotionally disturbed teenagers. There are no services for them at present he said.

The board agreed that the family and children's service committee should use the society's professional staff as resource personnel and its volunteer auxiliary as well.

Mrs. Audrey McLaughlin, a community worker with Metro Toronto Children's Aid Society, discussed prevention with the board by placing individual workers in specific geographic areas in work with professionals and agencies.

Mrs. McLaughlin said "In talking with professionals and residents I'm surprised at how much the society is still regarded as a baby-snatching agency. They are amazed to find out how interested we are to keep children in the home."

Pollution Probe is at present acting as secretariate for Garbage Collision.
