Expect Big Crowd At Fiddle Contest

A record crowd of nearly 3,000 persons is anticipated for the sixth annual Central Canadian Fiddling and Step-dancing Competition to be held in Perth, July 13 and 14. The competition will be staged at the Perth Community Centre under the sponsorship of the Perth Rotary Club in co-operation with the Perth and District Old-Time Fiddlers Association.

More than 90 competitors from Ontario, Quebec and New York State are expected to compete for \$1,300 in prize money and trophies in the nine categories. For the first time in the history of the competition, there will be a class for eight years and under step dancing. Classes in the Old-Time Fiddling are: open, 65 years and over, 18 years and under, 12 years and under. Classes in the step dancing are: open, 50 and over, 18 years and under, 12 years and under, 8 years and under.

No entries will be accepted after 10 p.m., July 12th.
